Willamette Valley – Whitewater rafting, mountain biking, kayaking

This nine-room guest lodge in the heart of the Willamette National Forest is more than just a place to stay — it's a basecamp for adventure. Tours depart right from the lodge, which is situated at the base of the Alpine Trail, renowned for its 14 miles (22.5 km) of epic singletrack. In fact the lodge provides the only ride-in/ride-out accommodations in the area. Mt. Hood/Gorge – E-bike tours of waterfalls

Ideal for all ages and ability levels, this e-bike tour is one of the best ways to see and experience Multnomah Falls and other nearby falls along the scenic corridor. It's offered year-round, which means you can experience the falls in all of their seasonal glory. Photo buffs might especially like the sunset tour. Traveling by e-bike means you can skip the parking hassles. And hiking to the falls is easy – just lock up your bike at each stop and hit the trail.

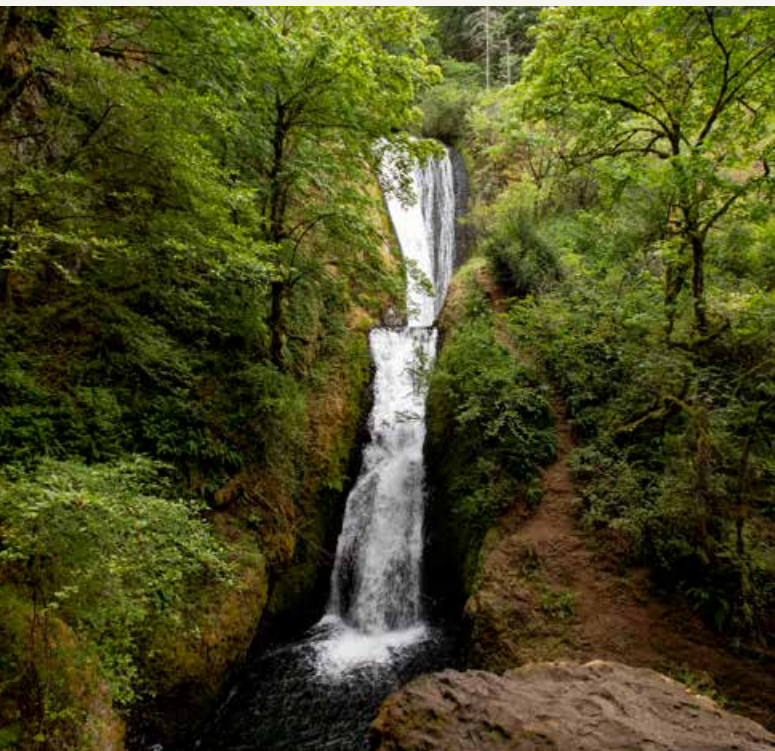
Portland – Walking culinary tours

When it's time to make a catch, you'll have all of the necessary gear and tackle, and your catch will even be cleaned so you can take it home for a DIY dinner. The Buoy 10 Astoria Salmon Fishing Tour is most popular, but other tours are offered year-round.



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
